Over 50 million people are trapped in modernday slavery.

This number includes 28 million people in forced labour, and 22 million in forced marriage.¹



Currently, homosexuality is criminalised in 64 countries.

In 12 of these countries, the **death penalty is a potential punishment** for same-sex activity. ³

Each year, 193,000 homicides occur among 15-29-year-olds, 40% of the global total.

The vast majority of homicides involve male victims.²

In 2024 there were 32,623 people living in Direct Provision and emergency International Protection accommodation

in Ireland.⁴

people were displaced within their own countries.

6.6 million of them were forced to move due to climate-related disasters.

In 2023, global military spending reached a record \$2.4 trillion,

with the United States, China, Russia, India, and Saudi Arabia making up 61% of the total.⁶

1,153 people were executed under the death penalty in 2023 - a 31% increase from 2022.



This excludes **potentially thousands more** secret, unrecorded executions.⁸

In 2023, over 122,000 battle-related deaths* were recorded globally,

marking the **third most violent year** since the end of the Cold War.⁷

*Battle-related deaths include people killed directly in combat (soldiers and civilians). They exclude deaths caused by war-related factors like hunger, disease, or lack of medical care.

In 2022,

the Global North provided \$115.9 billion in climate finance to the Global South.

As key drivers of climate change, it has been argued that **the Global North owes a lot more than this**.⁹
