FACT SHEET POVERTY AND INEQUALITY

559,850 people are living in poverty in Ireland today,

defined as having an income below 60% of the national median. **That's 10.7 % of the population.**¹

2.2 billion people worldwide

have a near or distance vision impairment.

The vision loss of over 1 billion people could have been prevented with adequate healthcare.²



The richest 1% in the world own 43% of the worlds wealth.³

754 million people worldwide do not yet have basic reading and writing skills.

Two out of three are women.⁴

people in the world experience acute multidimensional poverty*. Over half are children.⁵

*Acute multidimensional poverty means experiencing severe shortages in basic needs like food, clean water, healthcare, education, & housing all at the same time.

Women in politics:

Only 19 countries have a female head of state, and 17 have a female Head of government. 73% of seats in parliaments worldwide are held by men. Only 6 countries have 50% or more women in their national parliament.

Women and girls put in 12.5 billion hours

of unpaid work every day. 7

direct caring for children, the sick or elderly





indirect caring e.g. cooking, cleaning, shopping etc.
