The Education Officer will lead the delivery of education programmes and learning opportunities for schools, community groups and businesses across County Monaghan and surrounding Counties. This role plays a key part in advancing GAP's mission to empower people to live more sustainable lives and support local climate action through education and engagement.

The ideal candidate will bring a strong background in environmental education, excellent facilitation and coordination skills, and a passion for creating accessible, inclusive, and impactful learning experiences.

Role	The Education Officer coordinates and delivers environmental education programmes to schools, businesses and community groups across County Monaghan, and works closely with the Monaghan Programme Coordinator, the GAP Development Manager, CEO and the rest of the GAP Programmes team to deliver the activities and services that support our goals.
Purpose	The candidate should have experience working in the education sector (formal or informal) and will have good knowledge of environmental issues, initiatives around Ireland and the current political environment around Climate Action and sustainability. Experience of developing and delivering environmental education programmes is essential for this role.

Job Description

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Main Duties/Tasks	 Programme Delivery Plan and deliver environmental education programmes in line with GAP's strategic goals and funding agreements. Facilitate workshops and activities in schools, community centres and local organisations on topics such as biodiversity, climate action, sustainability and responsible consumption. Adapt educational content to suit different age groups and community needs. Build relationships with schools and education professionals throughout Monaghan, and surrounding counties where relevant.
	 2. Project Coordination & Administration Support day-to-day delivery of education and other programme activities, including scheduling and logistics. Ensure accurate documentation and reporting in line with funder and organisational requirements. Maintain strong internal communication with the wider GAP team and contribute to planning sessions as needed.
	 3. Programme Development Support the refinement and evolution of existing education programmes to reflect emerging environmental issues, national curriculum developments, and local community interests. Ensure programming is inclusive, engaging and behaviour change focused.
	 4. Monitoring & Evaluation Implement systems for capturing impact data, collecting feedback, and evaluating programme success. Prepare periodic reports for management, Monaghan County Council, and other stakeholders.
	 5. Representation & Outreach Act as an ambassador for Global Action Plan Ireland at local events, school visits, and meetings. Promote education programmes and support increased participation among diverse community groups.
	 6. Safeguarding & Compliance Ensure compliance with all relevant health & safety, child protection and GDPR policies in all activities. Apply best practices when working with children, young people and vulnerable adults.
